Legislation

<u>Hearing Aid Coverage for Children</u> <u>Ace, SB 206</u>

Georgia legislature passed the Hearing Aid Coverage for Children Act, which is awaiting the governor's signature. SB 206 requires that all health plans provide coverage of hearing aids for children. The coverage is up to \$3,000.00 per ear and provides for that amount for replacement aids

every 48 months. This bill's author emphasizes the critical importance of language development in the infant, toddler, and pre-school years for later school success.

The Expansion of Georgia's Medical Cannabis Law


Children in our care who are diagnosed with particular diseases/disorders including cancer, seizures

morning of your class to get prepared. You would enjoy your day so much more if you didn't have to rush around. It can bring the excitement back into your teaching if you are prepared. If you don't prepare for the child; they will prepare for you!

Prayer is the third and most

important. Make this a daily habit. We don't know what each child has been through before they come into our classroom. There is always one child that is a "puzzle piece". This habit can be the best "perkerupper" that you can have!

Choosing Toys can be Complicated! Most early childhood professionals give at least lip-service to the importance of play as the fundamental aspect of childhood. Many of us get bogged down in choosing toys that will enhance the quality of play. The latest Disney character may give some initial excitement but may not lead to the highest-quality play. When we have some money to spend, we often think we need to pick something overtly "educational" so it looks like we are really teaching.

What should we look for in choosing toys for our classrooms? Let's try to pick toys using the results of research that rates toys using the following:

 Will the child have the opportunity for exploration?

- Can the child engage in problem solving?
- Does the child show curiosity and ask questions when using the toy?
- Does the child show sustained interest?
- Can the child engage in creative expression?
- Can the toy be used with peers to collaborate and communicate?
- Can the child use the toy independently?

Toys and materials that meet some of these expectations may bring the most benefits. Quality play benefits children physically, cognitively, socially and emotionally. One of the coolest aspects of play is the non-stressed frame of mind a child experiences. As we pick toys for

our classrooms and structure play experiences for our students, let's make the most of this cherished aspect of childhood. Check out the NAEYC publication <u>Exploring Play</u> for more information.
